

PRESIDENT'S UPDATE - PLEASE SHARE!

July 2021

Happy Summer! While we're experiencing these high temperatures (at least not as high as the northwestern part of the country!), it's time to start thinking of skiing with Crescent Ski Council. Sign-ups started June 15th for both of Crescent's trips to Steamboat and Sun Valley. Registrations for both of these great trips are off to a good start. If you haven't yet signed up, be sure to do so soon. Several Clubs also have some great trips planned for this season. Be sure to check Club Trips on the website.

Speaking of Club Trips – as your club plans future ski trips, you may want to consider the snowiest resorts in the western part of the United States. This data, compiled by SnowBrains, is based on the average annual snowfall reported by all resorts. First on the list is Mt. Baker, Washington with 655 inches of snow, followed by Alyeska, Alaska with 650 inches. Third is Alta, Utah with 563 inches, then Timberline Lodge, Oregon with 551 inches. A seven-way tie with 500 inches each is Sugar Bowl CA, Kirkwood, CA, Snowbird, Solitude and Brighton, Utah and Grand Targhee, WY. Finishing out the top snowiest resorts are: Crystal Mountain, WA with 486 inches, Mt. Batchelor, OR with 463 inches, and Jackson Hole, WY with 459 inches. Tied in the final position are Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows, CA, and Stevens Pass, WA with 450 inches of snow each.

According to statistics from the 2020-2021 ski season, people were ready to hit the slopes as resorts opened. According to The National Ski Areas Association (NSAA), skier visit numbers to U.S. areas totaled 59 million for the 2020-21 ski season, the 5th best season on record and a strong recovery from the pandemic-shortened 2019-20 season. Additional data shows that the average U.S. ski area was open for 112 days this past season, up from 99 days in the pandemic-shortened 2019-20 season. Small and medium-sized ski areas (defined by lift capacity) performed well this winter, indicating more guests chose to stay close to home for ski trips. Ski areas reported the most common COVID-19 adjustments were skier capacity limits (both indoor and on-mountain), advance purchase or reservation requirements for both lift access and rental equipment, and changes to or elimination of group lessons. Despite these challenges, 78% of ski area operators said this season exceeded their expectations.
